	Have you read and doubled checked the Conditions of Entry ? (On Cookery webpage and
	Schedule)
	Childrens entries – make sure the child's name is entered as the exhibitor (not the parent), and
	their full name is used, eg Toby Smith, <u>not</u> Smith, T aged 5
Pro	esenting and bringing in your entries
	Have you put all entries on disposable plates? (Except classes where indicated)
	Have you put small items , eg biscuits, slice, sweets on small disposable plates ?
	Have you named the variety on the plate where required in the Schedule, eg Choc chip biscuits?
	Have you carefully checked each Class for how many of each piece are required , eg six biscuits,
_	or three bars of coconut ice?
	Have you checked that there is <u>no</u> fresh fruit, cream, custard or similar in any exhibit? These
	cannot be accepted for entry.
	Have you labelled <u>all</u> jars of preserves with the variety, eg Strawberry Jam?
	Have you ensured that your name is <u>not</u> written on the plate or jar ?
	Decorated cakes – have you checked that your cake board does not exceed 30x30 cm ?
	Have you taken off clingwrap, foil or other coverings before bringing your entries?
	Have you double checked the dates and times to bring your entries to the Cookery Pavilion?
	Thave you double checked the dates and times to similaryour entries to the cookery ravinon.

	Childrens decorated cakes – cannot exceed 30x30 base, and 20 cm height (to fit in our cabinets)
	Childrens cakes – (except for decorated cake classes 600 and 609) – have you checked that
	decorations are kept to a minimum? We understand that the little ones like to put sweets and
	even toys on cakes, but at the request of the judges please encourage them just to use icing only
	or simple decorations, eg sprinkles.
